CHECK IN Dallas **AIRPORT** Love Field (DAL) **WHY WE CHOSE IT**

When it opened in 1923, The Stoneleigh offered air conditioning (a rarity), and it's been drawing big names ever since, from Elvis Presley to Oliver Stone. A recent renovation restored the hotel to its Beaux Arts grandeur, earning it a place among *Condé Nast Traveler's* "Best New Hotels in the World." **BUSINESS DRAW** The Uptown location puts it near offices, restaurants, and the arts district. Hold meetings in the penthouse—where 500-year-old wood panels ring an entire room—then retreat to the hotel's full spa. **LOBBY LIZARD** The lavish Art Deco lobby bar may be the best in the city, both for its 1920s décor and its business-casual scene. Afterward, order new American cuisine at the hotel's adjoining Bolla restaurant. stoneleighhotel.com

TRAIL FIX

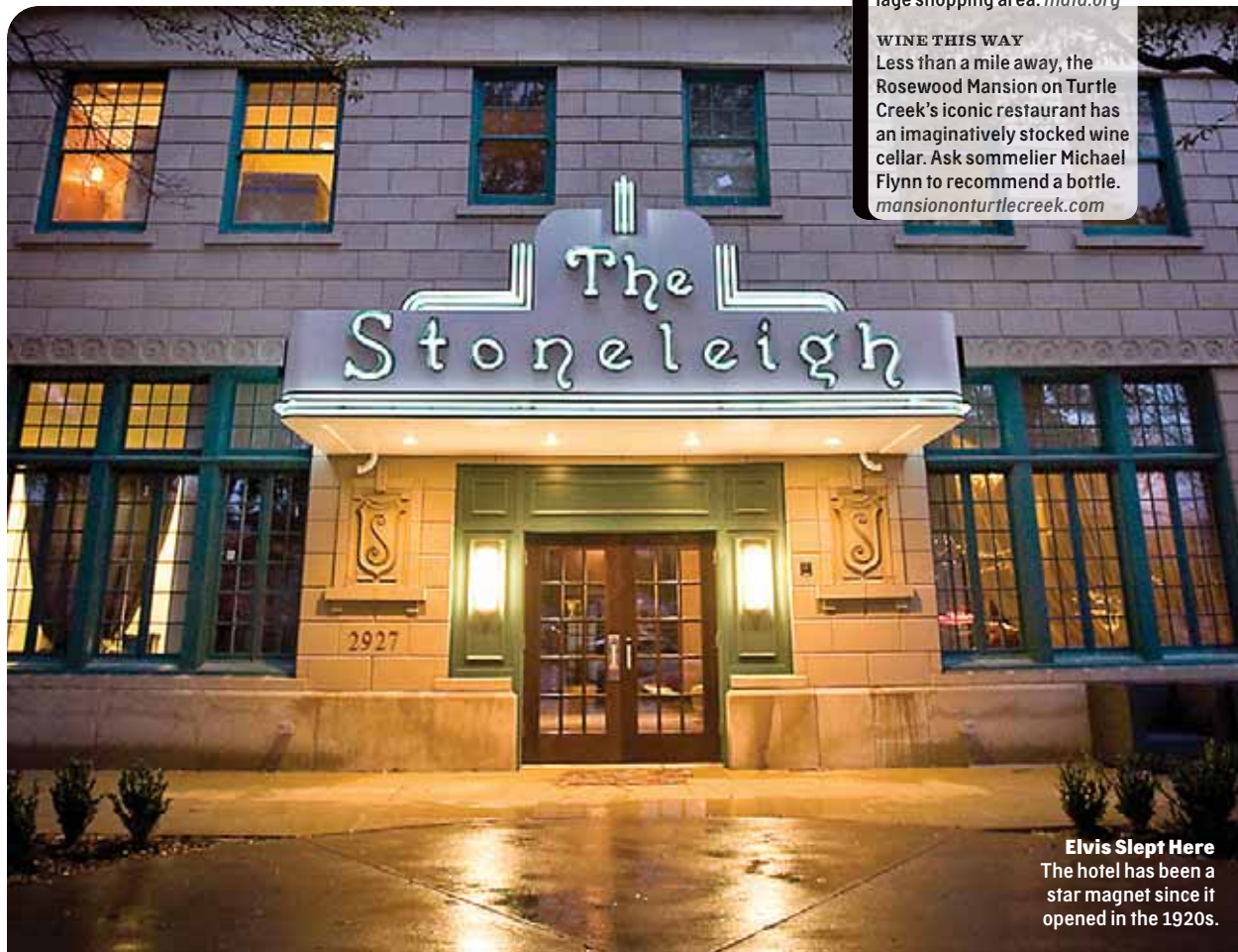
Jog along the 3.5-mile long Katy Trail, a path that runs through the heart of Big D. Enter at close by Reverchon Park. katytraildallas.org
